Stephen Paulus - Violin Concerto No. 3 (2012) Johannes Brahms – Symphony No. 2 in D major, op. 73

Roger Frisch, Associate Concertmaster of the Minnesota Orchestra, teams up with William Schrickel and the MSO to perform the regional premiere of Stephen Paulus' Violin Concerto No. 3, a work composed in 2012 on a commission from the Cleveland Orchestra. Paulus, who studied composition with Dominick Argento at the University of Minnesota, lived in St. Paul until his death in October 2014. Johannes Brahms composed his beautifully lyrical Symphony No. 2 while on summer holiday in 1877, and it has been a favorite of audiences and orchestral performers since its hugely successful debut in Vienna.

Dominick Argento's Casa Guidi won a Grammy Award in 2004. The song cycle, featuring mezzo soprano Clara Osowski, sets texts from letters that Elizabeth Barrett Browning sent to her sister back in England describing her happy Florentine life with her husband, poet/writer Robert Browning. Argento, who lives in Minneapolis, spent many summers living in Florence with his late wife, Carolyn Bailey. George Gershwin made two trips to Paris in the 1920s, and his American in Paris is a vivid musical description of a tourist absorbing the delicious atmosphere of the French capital. The MSO's Principal Oboe, Julie Brusen, performs as soloist in the lovely Oboe Concerto composed by Ames, Iowa native Peter Schickele (aka P.D.Q. Bach) in 1994.

Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky - Italian Capriccio, op. 45 Polina Nazaykinskaya – Concerto for Trombone and Orchestra Alexandre Guilmant – Symphony No. 2 for Organ & Orchestra, op. 91







Tchaikovsky composed his Italian Capriccio in a single week during January of 1880 while he was on holiday in Rome, creating a delightful musical fantasia that makes use of Italian folk tunes and a military fanfare he heard emanating from army barracks near his hotel. Douglas Wright, Principal Trombone of the Minnesota Orchestra, takes the soloist's spotlight as William Schrickel and the MSO present the midwest premiere of Russian composer Polina Nazaykinskaya's recently composed Trombone Concerto. The curtain comes down on the orchestra's 2015-2016 season in spectacular fashion with the Twin Cities premiere of Alexandre Guilmant's Organ Symphony No. 2, with Kathrine Handford pulling out all the stops on the magnificent organ at Saint Andrew's.
