




Support The Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra.

Identity & Purpose The Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra, an independent organization founded in 1982 as the Central Chamber Orchestra, is composed of musicians devoted to performing good music of all periods from baroque to contemporary. The musicians audition for membership and perform without pay for audiences throughout the Twin Cities metropolitan area. There are two primary reasons for the orchestra's existence: 1) to provide an opportunity for serious musicians to perform fine music; and 2) to offer the pleasure of high quality concerts to music lovers in the metropolitan area.

Music Director Manny Laureano, who begins his second season as the orchestra's music director, has held the post of principal trumpet with the Minnesota Orchestra since 1981. A native New Yorker, Manny was educated at Julliard, a finalist in the 1975 International Trumpet Competitions, and played principal trumpet with the Seattle Symphony before assuming his present appointments. He has conducted the Calhoun-Isles Community Band and free-lance conducted in the Twin Cities area as well as in Seattle, Washington. Manny was recently appointed music director of The Minnesota Youth Symphonies.

Support The chief avenue of support for the orchestra is the Metropolitan Symphony Orchestral Association, a non-profit organization made up of contributors of various levels and run by a Board of Directors. Donations at concerts and grant monies, rather than ticket sales, also provide some support for the orchestra. The Board invites new members to join the Association. Members elect the Board and receive concert schedules and information.
