IDENTITY AND MISSION Described as "the very model of a modern major orchestra—community style," by the Minneapolis StarTribune, the Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra is on its way to becoming the best civic orchestra in the region. Its mission is to provide an opportunity for serious musicians to perform music of all periods and styles at the highest professional level to diverse audiences throughout the metropolitan area.

MUSIC DIRECTOR Manny Laureano has led the Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra as its music director since 1987 and has also held the post of principal trumpet with the Minnesota Orchestra since 1981 and co-music director of the Minnesota Youth Symphonies since 1988. A native New Yorker, Mr. Laureano was educated at Julliard, was a finalist in the 1975 International Trumpet Competitions and played principal trumpet with the Seattle Symphony before assuming his present appointments here in Minnesota.
