

IDENTITY AND MISSION Described as "the very model of a modern major orchestra—community style," by the Minneapolis StarTribune, the Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra is on its way to becoming the best civic orchestra in the region. Its mission is to provide an opportunity for serious musicians to perform music of all periods and styles at the highest professional level to diverse audiences throughout the metropolitan area.

MUSIC DIRECTOR Manny Laureano has led the Metropolitan Symphony Orchestra as its music director since 1987. He has also held the post of principal trumpet with the Minnesota Orchestra since 1981 and has been co-music director of the Minnesota Youth Symphonies since 1988. A native New Yorker, Mr. Laureano was educated at Julliard, was a finalist in the 1975 International Trumpet Competitions and played principal trumpet with the Seattle Symphony before assuming his present appointments here in Minnesota.

GUEST CONDUCTOR Ching-Hsin Hsu is a native of Taiwan and holds a Masters degree in doublebass and an Artist Diploma in conducting from the Hartt School of Music, University of Hartford in Connecticut. She is presently the Music Director of the St. Cloud State University Orchestra, the Heartland Symphony Orchestra, the Central Minnesota Youth Symphony and this past summer was appointed Assistant Conductor at the Peter Britt Music Festival in Medford, Oregon.

GUEST CONDUCTOR Roland Vamos studied violin and viola at Julliard where he received a B.S., M.S. and a Doctorate of Musical Arts. He has an extensive background in performance and teaching and has directed various orchestras, most recently at Western Illinois University. He is currently professor of violin and viola at the University of Minnesota and in the summer judges international competitions and teaches at the Bowdoin Music Festival in Maine.
